Today's Readings

First Reading Isaiah 55:10-11 God's word succeeds in what it is sent to do.

Second Reading Romans 8:18-23
We ourselves and the whole of creation retain the hope of freedom and glory.

Gospel Matthew 13:1-23

Christ, the Word of God, the seed of the sower, produces an astonishing crop.

We congratulate Jimmy Neary who was the recipient of the *Alexander Hamilton Immigrant Achievement award* this gone 4th of July. He has been recognized as an migrant who has made outstanding contribution to his city and country.

Jesus' parable in the gospel of today sounds rather incredible. A serious and sensible sower would sow the seeds where they will produce a harvest, he would sow on fertile soil. But a careful look at the sower in the parable shows that he is a careless sower. He didn't mind where the seeds would fall because some seeds fells on the edge of the path and were eaten up by birds, some fell on patches of rock and others fell among thorns. That is fruitless sowing, not fruitful sowing. It is futile not fertile sowing. But obviously some fell on rich soil and brought out their crops, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.

Jesus astonishingly ended the parable with this statement: "whoever has ears must listen." And even now as we listen to the story, we may be asking whether the sower was wasting his time and effort and the seeds or not. Why bother one's self sowing seeds that will end up as bird food? Why bother sowing seeds that will not germinate or that will eventually be choked and die?

But what we learn in life and must continue to learn is that nothing goes wasted, because to every action there is a reaction. There may be delay in the reaction through distraction or obstruction by resistance and opposition, but there will still be a reaction.

The usage of words is one characteristic of this action and reaction. Words are not cheap but they are effective. Words have the power to ignite an explosion. And even more so is the Word of God. The 1st reading tells us that God's Word does not return to Him empty without carrying out His will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.

It's true that when God speaks, it's like we have some difficulty hearing Him. But as it is said practice makes perfect so it could be that, as practicing Catholics, we will gradually be close to being perfect. We come for Mass every week or daily, we hear God's Word in the scripture readings, but does it have any effect on us?

One day a man told his wife: "I will stop going for Mass because I listen to the readings, I hear the priests preach but I can't remember anything. It is of no benefit to me. So I will stop going for Mass". The wife replied after thinking for a while and said: "Then I will stop cooking for you! Because you are not able to remember what you ate yesterday and the day before, you are only getting fat and it's not good for you. So I will stop cooking for you".

That maybe also be our own life story. We feel that nothing is happening to us, even as we try to listen to God. But God will continue to talk to us, He will not stop speaking to us because His Word is at work in us everyday. And God's Word will never return to Him empty without carrying out His will and succeeding in what it was sent to do. God wants us to keep listening, and He will change the story of our lives. It may sound unbelievable but that is the truth of the power of God's Word. We have the ears and the heart, let us therefore listen to the Word of God, keep it always in our hearts and produce a great harvest.
