THE LORD IS KIND AND MERCIFUL

At the very end of the 2nd Reading today, St. Paul warns us that "Whoever thinks [he/she] is standing secure should take care not to fall" (1 Cor 10:12). While that is sound advice for those of us with leg and hip problems, it is even more important for us who are too sure of our own goodness and righteousness and definite opinions. Such confidence is what got the ancient Israelites in trouble and kept them in slavery to the Egyptians for 400+ years before Moses, then kept them wandering in the desert for quite a few years afterwards, as Paul reminded the Corinthians several times throughout his letters to them.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus rattled the secure cages of those caught up in their own judgment about the guilt and suffering of the Galileans, whose blood Pilate had mingled with their own blood in their sacrifices. Jesus warned His people that the sins of the Galileans and of those killed in Siloam were no greater than their own sins. He assured them that unless they repented of their own sins, their fate would see them perishing in the same way as the people they were judging.

Always in need of God's love and forgiveness, His care and kindness, we are reminded over and over again in the Psalm (Ps 103) today that in the midst of our sinfulness and need, "The Lord is kind and merciful." . . . The beautiful story from Exodus today (3:1ff), the 1st Reading, lets us know in truth how much God honors and cherishes us, His children, in spite of our sinfulness. Calling to Moses from holy ground, God entrusted him not only with God's Holy Name "Yahweh" (I Am Who Am, I Am the One Who is always Present), but God also entrusted Moses with the precious burden of caring for His Chosen People. It was not an easy job.

During Lent, the Church asks us to tend to our own fasting and prayer and giving of alms, so that we might win pardon for our own sins and perhaps those of others. But we are asked to take care to forgive others rather than to judge them. Lest we fall.
