## Mission is the Activity of The Church

A thing's purpose dictates its form. Its mission determines its shape. That's why a knife differs in shape from a spoon. It's why a house differs in shape from a pen. Purpose determines shape or form. It seems obvious, but the implications are far reaching.

Consider the purpose of the Church. What is its mission? What shape must the life of the Church take in order to match its mission by God's design? When it comes to the purpose of the Church, we often **start in the wrong place**, approaching it backwards. That is, we begin with the wrong reality. We can take the Church as a given, and then we ask, "What is the Church's mission?"

As scholar Christopher J. H. Wright has said, "[I]t is not so much the case that God has a mission for his Church in the world, but rather that God has a Church for his mission in the world. Mission was not made for the Church; the Church was made for mission—God's mission" (14). "The church is the consequence, the result, of God's own missionary activity."

Christ's mission in the Church has and continues to come forth in fresh and new ways. In the 19<sup>th</sup> century, when the Lord wanted the mission to be rooted in Africa, His Spirit called missionaries to found institutes designed for this specific purpose. The Society of African Missions (SMA) was one of them. These men were true ambassadors of Christ's message proclaiming it with a firm purpose. On December 8, 1856, our founder Bishop Melchior de Brésillac with a few other priests made the pilgrimage to the Shrine of Notre Dame de Fourviere, near Lyons, France and there established the Society to the patronage of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Each in turn took an oath: "...here and now I offer my life to God, accepting in advance and with joy, for His greater glory ... the pains and privations, the hardship... the suffering of persecution, and even martyrdom, should God deem me worthy to bear witness to the faith by my death..."

What is the Lord's purpose for the SMA? It has as its principal aim the evangelization of the countries of Africa which have most need of missionaries. Independently of the care it will be given to the missions, the SMA constantly works to prepare ways for penetrating into the places in Africa where there are no missionaries yet.

Like Bishop de Brésillac, our identity as ambassadors is connected to Christ's missionary purposes in the world. Jesus has saved us from sin, but he saved us for mission, making us his own representatives. Indeed, that's what ambassadors are: representatives who speak and act on the king's behalf, under his authority, carrying out his desires.

Finally, it means we embrace our calling on mission. Jesus says, "As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you" (John 20:21). This is not only for missionaries and church planters. It's a job description for us all – as ambassadors of the Gospel. It's the purpose of the Church.
