Today's Readings

First Reading Isaiah 2:1-5

We climb the mountain of God separately, but we meet at the summit.

Second Reading Romans 13:11-14

We are in the night, but we can see the dawn is coming.

Gospel Matthew 24:37-44

Pray, think, care, and then you will be awake, ready for God in all things.

REFLECTION

Advent begins with a call to vigilance. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells us to "Be vigilant and at all times pray." There are so many Scriptural passages that call us to vigilance in anticipation of Jesus' coming. Being vigilant means also that we are prepared, we are ready for Him, we are not caught with our pants down so to speak. Imagine if Christmas morning you got up and realized that you hadn't bought any food, had not shopped for any gifts, and had no idea what you were going to that day. This scenario would never happen. However, all of us, to varying extents, allow this scenario to play out in a spiritual sense. Our hearts are not prepared to celebrate the birth of Christ...

Not only is Advent a time to celebrate Jesus' first coming to us in the flesh, it is also a time to acknowledge that his first coming is ultimately fulfilled in his glorious second coming. This is what this Sunday's Gospel says where Jesus tells us to "Stay alert" for that day. Jesus will come again in heavenly glory and splendor to judge the living and the dead. We also profess this fact each Sunday when we say the Nicene Creed. However, do we really understand and take to heart what we profess? Probably not...

As Advent begins, reflect upon how prepared you are for Jesus' coming. Are you preparing with same fervor that you prepare for Christmas by shopping, cooking, decorating the Christmas tree and setting up the lights on the house? If you think that maybe you are not as prepared for His return in glory as you'd like to be, make this Advent a time when you get your heart ready. Try to commit to spending some quality time in prayer and or meditating on the Scriptural passages of the Annunciation, Visitation, and Nativity and what it means to you. Also, can you think of a better way to get your heart ready for His return than to spend an hour of power with Him during Eucharistic Adoration? By taking a little extra time for prayer and reflection, you will open the door to a closer relationship with the one who fashioned you and loves you most of all.
