REFLECTION

On this 4th Sunday of Advent the focus is on Mary and Joseph. Let's put our minds back to the ancient near east 2000 years ago in the tiny, closed knit community of Nazareth in Galilee. A mid teenage woman becomes visibly pregnant before she is married. Her fiancée who is not the father decides to quietly divorce her without raising any trouble. She becomes an object of shame for her entire community. Then, out of nowhere comes Joseph's dream, where an angel tells Joseph to take Mary into his home and that the child was conceived of the Holy Spirit. You can imagine how the village people would have reacted if Joseph was to say, it is not my child but was conceived by the Holy Spirit...Ohh Kay...

Joseph and Mary became the Holy Family, one that was to endure the hardships of ridicule, most likely discrimination, and certainly shame from the community. However, their faith in God, in what God's will was, pulled them through as a couple. Our blessed mother was invited by God to face her pregnancy in faith. Her response was perfect, "Let it be done to me according to your word." She could not explain nor understand what was happening but, she knew deep down in her soul that God was in charge. Similarly, Joseph entered into the mystery of marriage, an initially awkward one at that, based on complete faith in God knowing that he would be foster father to a son who would save God's people from their sin.

The Holy family worked as a team throughout their relationship. There was never an issue of who wore the pants. At the Nativity and Presentation Mary was the lead parent. However, when Joseph got the family up in the middle of the night to escape to Egypt Mary didn't give him any pushback. Both parents nurtured, mentored and educated Jesus. When Joseph was at work and the young Jesus fell playing, scraping his leg, it was his mom Mary who cleaned his wounds and dressed them. At the Cross she did the same thing spiritually in supporting Jesus when his friends had abandoned him. Today, I invite all couples to act upon your own invitations from God to embrace the mysteries of life and marriage more fully. For those families that are led by single parents, trust me, God is with you too and Jesus, Mary and Joseph want to be a part of your life just as much as with anyone else, even more so, they know what hardship is all about and they gravitate to those undergoing it! I exhort you to invite them to be with you and help you in raising your children...they will gladly oblige, you just have to ask!
