Advent 4 Reflection

WHAT'S IN A NAME

Names tell us something about the person named. The gospels for the Advent and Christmas seasons furnish us with a long list of names for God. Some names are descriptions--Prince of Peace, Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God. These all attempt to tell us who Jesus is by what he does. And then again, we have personal names for God, and these too are not without meaning.

The three readings this morning all focus on the identity of Jesus. Who is he? What does he do? We might say that a name is a word in search of a person and an identity. It can do many things. Maybe it's a kind of sign, indicating a destination, or maybe it's telling us what to expect from this person.

This morning, the name Emmanuel, meaning "God with us", makes its appearance for the first time in the Bible. No one had ever called God by that name before. It was something that Matthew the evangelist came up with all by himself and reflected his own vision of God. Paul, in his turn, tries to answer the same questions. He claims that Jesus is descended by flesh from David the king, and at the same time he proclaims that Jesus is the Son of God according to the Spirit of holiness through resurrection from the dead. Jesus has a lot to live up to.

The Gospel reading explores the meaning of one more name. Take a look at that first line from Matthew's gospel. "This is how the birth of Jesus (the) Christ came about." Here we meet the name Christ for the first time. Christ means "the anointed one" It's the same meaning as the word Messiah in Hebrew. Jesus is anointed by God for a purpose—to lead, to counsel, to console, to save from futility. These new names—Emmanuel and Christ—shining in their newness, tell us that something new is happening in Jesus Christ that never happened before.

This Advent season, can we hear these names anew? Can we approach the manger in the stable with a sense that something new is happening, not only in the world but also in our own lives? Let me push the envelope here: Can we approach in faith this God 'being with us' such that we no longer rely exclusively on our own ability to plan for the future and to get ourselves out of any difficulties we encounter? ... Can we acknowledge all the blessings we have received from God's providence in our lives?

And since we're talking of names, just remember that the name Jesus means 'Yahweh saves.' By Fr Frank Wright, SMA
